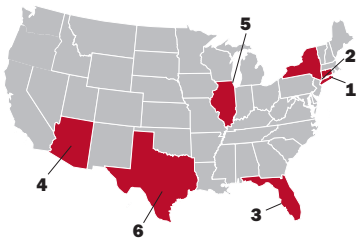


This week: Glass homes



1 ◀ **East Hampton, N.Y.** Argentine architect Jorge Sosa built this four-bedroom home near Hands Creek in 2006. The house has a two-story glass curtain wall, a chef's kitchen, a downstairs junior suite, and an open loft with a fireplace, library, and master suite with private balcony. 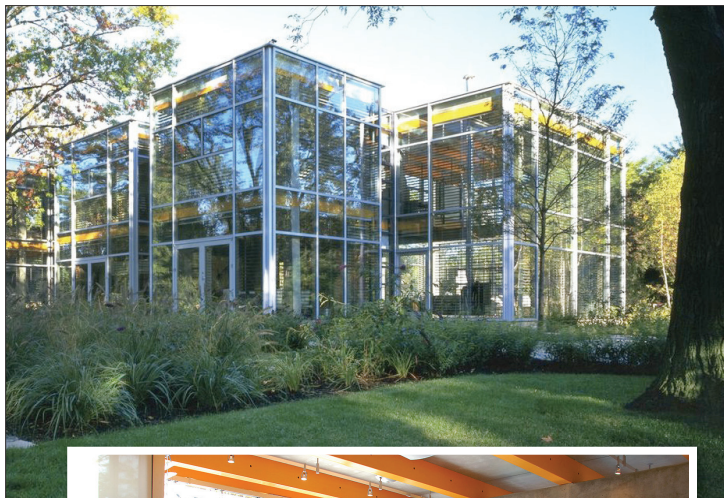
2 ▶ **New Canaan, Conn.** Lee House 1 was built in 1952 by architect John Black Lee and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The two-bedroom home features hardwood floors, a fireplace, abundant light, and cedar closets. It sits atop a large rock on three lush acres with trees that create a rich canopy. \$1,350,000. 3 ▶ **Sarasota, Fla.** This four-bedroom home was built in 1960 by renowned architect Philip Hiss, and updated in 2013. Features include the original diamond-cut terrazzo floors, a gourmet kitchen with marble island, and a master suite with dual shower, soaking tub, and walk-in closets. Outside are a pool and covered patio, drought-tolerant landscaping, and private access to Lido Beach and the Gulf of Mexico. \$2,499,000. 4 ▶ Paradise Valley, Ariz. The custom steel-and-glass windows of this 2016 four-bedroom house give expansive views of the northeast valley. Other features include concrete floors, rift-cut oak woodwork, a Crestron control system, an exercise room, and a master suite with a soaking tub and oversize shower. 5 ▲ Northfield, Ill. This five-bedroom, award-winning smart home was built by architect Thomas Roszak as his private residence. Constructed out of commercial-grade glass and concrete and steel beams, the house features limestone and cherrywood floors, high-end bath fixtures, and an Italian designer kitchen.
